FOR WOMEN, the corridors of real business power in Britain have remained a virtual no-go area. But last year, beautiful Davinia Prince made it all the way to the top.

It was done with a mixture of charm, acquired skill and business acumen, and it happened in *The Foundation*.

By the end of the series last September, Davinia, widowed mother of two young children, had become joint managing director of a multi-million pound property development company. On Friday, the series returns for a further 17 episodes, with Davinia, played by Lynette Davies, facing new adventures in the boardroom.

Although the series was dubbed by at least one chauvinist as the "Petticoat

Power Game," many women wrote to say they found it hopefully inspiring. Inevitably, it called into question the ability of women to handle both their emotional and business lives.

In the first episode last year, Davinia's husband, Don, died of a heart attack. Don had risen to the head of a property empire and creator of the Prince Foundation for One-Parent Families.

The board of the Prince Organisation attempted to buy off Davinia by offering her £2 million for her share of the business, but Davinia, who discovered that her husband had been having an affair with a younger woman, decided to prove she could compete with men on equal terms.

She was at first opposed by the Chair-

man of the board. Played by John Barron, Sir Clive Farmer is a man of impeccable background: Eton, Oxford and the Guards. He is charming, polite, always in command, and by the end of the series had gained considerable respect for Davinia's abilities.

From his original standpoint—summed up when he said, "I have nothing against listening to a pretty woman, nothing at all"—Sir Clive came to the conclusion that Davinia was almost as clever as himself.

Don Prince's right-hand man, the enigmatic and asexual Ronnie Bartlett (Geoffrey Whitehead), had expected to be in sole control of the company. At first he resented Davinia's interference but, like Sir Clive, found himself



admiring her drive and enthusiasm.

Other members of the board, who were of more immediate support to Davinia, are bachelor solicitor Gareth Brown (William Gaunt) and the family doctor, Richard Montagu (Peter Copley). Brown's interest in Davinia might well be something more than mere business, but Montagu's role is clearly that of the family friend, although in the new series he becomes disenchanted with some of Davinia's methods.

Davinia's success in the boardroom had been remarkable, but by the end of the last series, her emotional life showed little improvement. She had become romantically involved first with an up-and-coming property agent, Douggie Taylor (Nicky Henson). They went on

a business trip to Amsterdam where she met Dutch businessman Phillipe de Vries (Sandor Eles), but this second affair ended sadly when Davinia discovered de Vries was married.

In the new series, Davinia, still trying to find happiness on two often conflicting levels, discovers she has a secret admirer. And in a later episode, she meets Bill Wood (Mark McManus).

Wood is the construction manager of a large company headed by Sam Wyatt (Fulton MacKay), a charming but ruthless bully and one of Davinia's new boardroom problems.

Another woman joins the Prince power game next week. She's Patricia Walker, played by Janet Spencer-Turner—you can meet her on page 15.

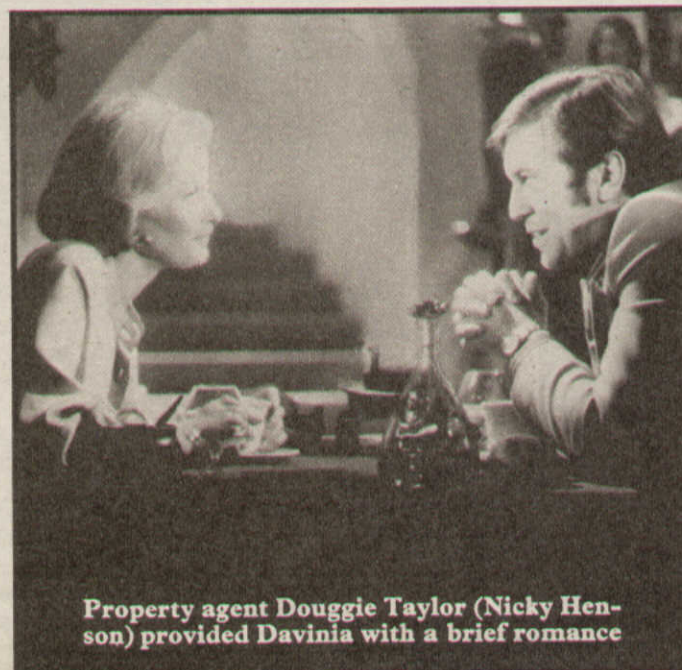

Will the Dark Lady rock the Foundation?

PATRICIA WYATT walks into the big-business intrigue of *The Foundation* next week. But the big question both for newcomers to the series and addicts who have followed the story from the outset is: how will this new character affect the destiny of joint Managing Director Davinia Prince and Co.?

Patricia is the daughter of Sam Wyatt, the head of a rival giant construction firm, and in next week's episode she is installed as Davinia's personal assistant. She's young and pretty but, compared with the astute Davinia, she seems naïve and uncultured in the politics of big business. But can the daughter of a pushy and ruthless tycoon remain content with a back seat at the Prince organisation?

What is certain is that the elfin, brown-eyed Janet Spencer-Turner, who plays Patricia, will be the face you can't forget by the end of next month. As well as her meaty part in *The Foundation*, you can see her this and next week in *Will Shakespeare* as Will's mysterious lover, The Dark Lady of the Sonnets.

Born on the Isle of Wight, the grand-daughter of a music hall singer, Janet, 26, learned her trade at the Brighton School of Drama before

touring in repertory and gaining a minimum of TV experience. She was very appealing as Little Nell in *Dickens*, and had a small character part in *General Hospital*. Now, two major roles crop up in the same month.

"It's pure chance that the two series are on at the same time," she says. "I made *Shakespeare* two years ago and I'd almost forgotten about it, although it will be interesting to see how it looks on screen. The Dark Lady was a real puzzle in the life of Shakespeare—we know that she existed, but nobody knows just who she was, and John Mortimer, who wrote the series, has visualised her as a tantalising, opportunist lady who drives her men to distraction."

After Victorian costumes in *Dickens* and the finery of Elizabethan dress in *Shakespeare*, Janet was beginning to think she was going to be typecast in period parts, until *The Foundation* turned up. "It was nice to get back to modern dress again," she says, "although I wouldn't say the clothes Patricia Wyatt wears are the clothes I would choose for myself."

When she's not playing love games with Shakespeare or negotiating the boardroom jungle in *The Foundation*, Janet prefers a casual, easy-going life in the neat terraced cottage in Richmond, Surrey, where she lives with her solicitor-husband Martin. Asked to change into something for our picture, she emerged in her favourite rough-and-ready gear: pink and mauve rugby shirt, skin-tight emerald green cords, and a scruffy brown cardigan. She has two boisterous poodles, a passion for extra-strong peppermints and is never happier than when burning up a load of weeds and rubbish in her garden incinerator.

When you can drag her away from the weeding and romping with the dogs along the Thames towpath at Richmond, she learns her words, tucked away from all distractions, on the floor between the bed and the window in her bedroom. "It's my private little place where I can really concentrate on work. I simply tell my friends I'm retiring to the west wing."

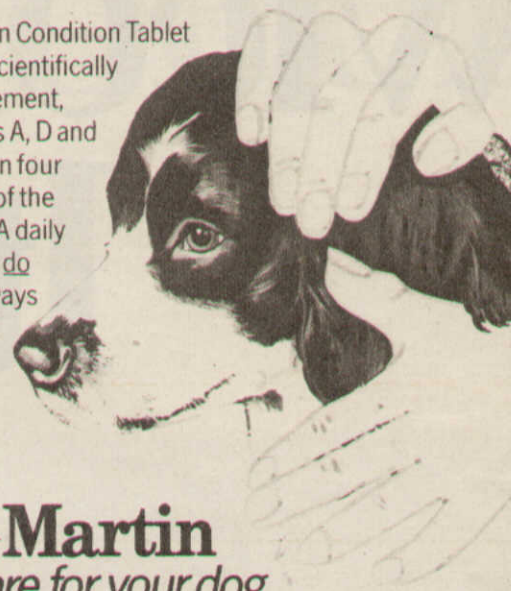

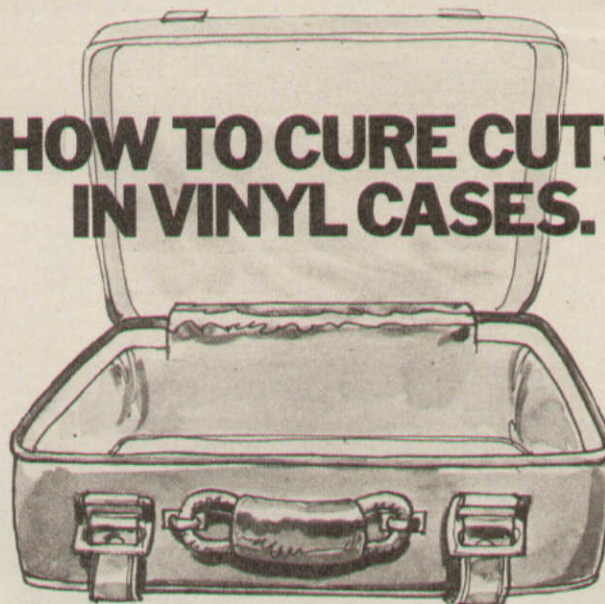

HERE TODAY, Goon tomorrow. That's Harry Secombe's own caption for this picture. And shortly after it was taken in the garden of his Cheam home in Surrey, he took off for Australia.

A WORLD CUP without the pontificating Alf Garnett; without the absurdity of his opinions? Well, it doesn't seem quite the same. So you're getting yer actual Alf in Saturday's film, *The Alf Garnett Saga*, a sequel to the first, *Till Death Us Do Part*.

Everybody that is, except viewers in the Scottish Television region who'll have to wait until later in the summer before seeing Garnett's answer to *Forsyte*.

The rest will see George Best, Bobby Moore, and other soccer stars as Alf follows the fortunes of West Ham. But no bulldozing words on the World Cup.

Time to put that right. Here's Alf (courtesy of his mentor Johnny Speight), kicking off in his council flat in a tower block.

Which only goes to show that acting can sometimes be a matter of convenience.

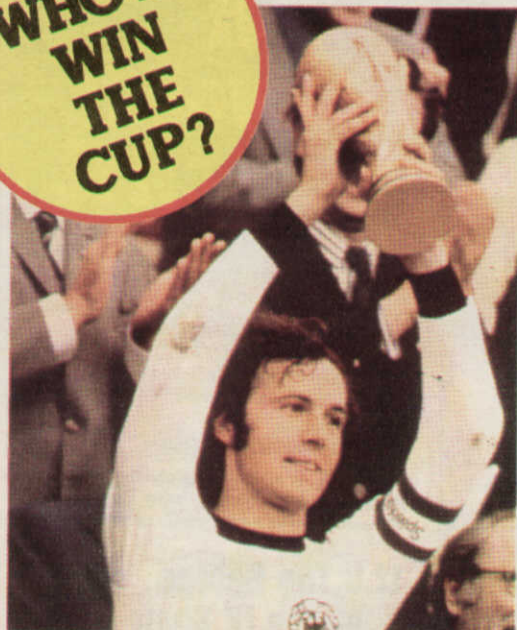
